## Reflections at the End of the Gakyil's Term

January 2024 marks the end of term for three of the current Gakyil members. Two members, Mark and John, will be departing, while Al will remain along with Marsha who joined one year ago. At this time of the "changing of the guard", we thought it might be useful to offer our reflections on our Gakyil experience and thoughts about the future.

On Being on the Gakyil - During the past three years the process of being on the Gakyil during the pandemic was very different from the past. Rather than infrequent, long, in-person meetings at the schoolhouse, we were able to meet weekly or bi-weekly on Zoom. Whatever issues we dealt with, whether it was planning retreats, resolving banking issues, dealing with property emergencies, or myriad other issues, this Gakyil never needed to take a vote on what action to take. Each Color took the lead for their issues, consulted and coordinated with the other Colors and Friends and made decisions collectively. On the Community's Energy - Rinpoche's wisdom and energy are still very much alive in the community.
